Members of the Rensselaer community,

Last night the presidents of campus fraternities voted almost unanimously to not endorse Save RPI Greek Life's march planned for this Friday. The Panhellenic Council also did not endorse the march.

Most fraternity presidents and some sororities also sent emails to their members encouraging them not to attend, with some stating there would be sanctions for involvement.

Save RPI Greek Life organized the march with the hope of building solidarity within the Greek community and advocating against deferred recruitment and the new drug & alcohol policy.

Deferred recruitment and the Arch, according to estimates from IFC and Panhel, will cost the community over \$1 million a year. The results will be catastrophic and lead to many fraternities being financially inviable.

The vote yesterday does not constitute a lack of support against the issues, as evident by attendance at the Greek Life Forum, but a difference in how we should approach the problem.

Thank you to all those that supported our march and helped us plan the event. We will be considering the future of Save Greek Life in the coming days and how to proceed in the future.
